Call for papers by June 1st. Prof. Igor Jerman and the organisers would like to invite scientists doing any research concerning our five sections (see below) to present their findings or ideas. The aim of the Conference is introducing new frontiers of the scientific

explanation of life and cognition. These new frontiers go beyond the molecular and biochemical understanding of life. Even though molecular biology has brought new insight into the organisation of biological systems, many questions have remained unanswered. Looking for new horizons of biology demands a multidisciplinary approach that will be implemented by the work of five Sections.
