Christopher Thomson, Emilios Bouratinos - The Foundation for the Science of Consciousness

Our aim is to co-operate in the evolution of the science of consciousness, and to promote this knowledge in ways which will benefit individuals and society.

There is a virtual avalanche of interest in consciousness these days. This is apparent in the number of conferences, books, and other publications on the subject. People are talking about the 'science of consciousness', but it is not at all clear what this means. Some assume that it means the application of current scientific methods, data, and assumptions to the subject of consciousness. They see it as the exploration of consciousness by science. Others, often from within some spiritual tradition, think of it as the continuation into modern times of ancient knowledge, together with traditional methods of acquiring this knowledge. Still others, mostly from academia, insist on approaching the subject critically and philosophically. While there are, of course, many other views and approaches, the fact is that if a true science of consciousness is ever to emerge, it is essential that no single approach dominate the agenda. So, although there can be no doubt that science and scientists will have much that is useful to say about consciousness, what is really required is complementarity between all points of view, all approaches.

The science of consciousness is unique in that we are investigating what we are investigating with! Consciousness can only be known by itself. This must surely imply that the science of consciousness can only be developed by people who are making the effort to develop their own consciousness. There is a fundamental distinction to be made between, on the one hand, being able to infer the presence of consciousness from certain traits and behaviour and, on the other, being able to experience consciousness directly. The former is what scientists currently do when they study consciousness. The latter is a different matter altogether.

It is our view that one of the minimum requirements for the investigation of consciousness is the ability to experience consciousness directly. What this means in practice is that we have to start with ourselves. We have to learn to become ever more aware of who we are, in a process of self-realization. As we gradually become more conscious of our own consciousness, we can slowly graduate to the direct experience of the consciousness of others. As we do, we become true scientists of consciousness. Trying to investigate the nature of consciousness without developing the ability to experience our own consciousness much more deeply and the consciousness of another directly is rather like trying to investigate the nature of flowers without having developed our senses of smell and sight.

The Foundation's initial activities will probably include the following: we shall say exactly what we mean by 'consciousness'; we shall say why we think it important that a science of consciousness be initiated and developed, and what benefits night accrue from this; we shall suggest how the scientists of consciousness might go about developing their own consciousness such that they become better equipped to investigate consciousness; we shall say what aspects of consciousness should, in our opinion, be investigated, perhaps in some order of priority.
