*The statistical approach to interpretation, processing of results and checking of hypotheses in experiments on revealing of human abilities of ESP* - by Dr. Andrei Lee and A.G. Chunovkina (13 pp.) Analyses the sequence of correct answers in a series in a way which allows for the peculiarity of ESP.

*The development of ways of effort synchronisation in operator groups for realising the telekinetics phenomenon* - by Dr. Andrei Lee and T.K. Ivanova (12 pp.). Discusses experiments on inducing the rotation of a propeller inside a glass case.

*Keys to Homeostasis*- by Dr. Daniel Miller (10 pp, from *European Journal of Clinical Hypnosis, Spring, 1995* ). Considers consciousness and chaos and its link to democracy as a self-organising system.
