Igor Grigorjev Experiments on Psychoemotional States (PES) and Composition of Saliva

Igor has carried out series of experiments o study PES influence on the protein spectrum (within the range of 18-200 kD molecular weights) of a person¹s mixed saliva. It was found that people with spiritual or altruistic consciousness have their saliva protein with a strongly enriched fraction within 50-55 kD. People with normal consciousness have low contents of these proteins, while strong depression or excitement vastly inhibited secretion of 50-55 kD proteins. Joint spiritual aspiration of consciousness of two friendly people resulted in harmonisation of their saliva protein pattern within ten minutes. Dr. James Dyson Work on Treatment of Cancer with Viscum

James gave a very well received presentation on this work at the Annual Meeting in Warwick. The work has its roots in the anthroposophical approach to medicine, developed by Rudolf Steiner and Dr. Ita Wegman in the early part of the century. Steiner himself was the first to recommend the use of viscum (mistletoe) as a cancer treatment. Work since that time has reinforced Steiner¹s original insight and has provided evidence that science, medical practice and spiritual research can fructify each other. Kevin McCarthy - Emotional Education

Learning by Heart is a short pamphlet which calls for recognition of the place of emotional education to raise achievement in schools. New thinking, its authors assert, is providing a clearer picture of the range of human capacities or intelligences. Based on research in Britain, Europe and the USA, the report demonstrates that emotionally literate pupils are not only more tolerant, more sensitive to others and better able to form better relationships, but also more likely to improve their scores in literacy and numeracy tests. Investing time and energy in programmes of self-esteem, teaching pupils to recognise, name and channel their emotional energy will help raise academic standards.

It also seeks greater acknowledgement of the emotional dimension of all subjects: a feeling for other cultures in geography, awe and wonder in science as well as greater emphasis on cross-subject relationships.
