Complementary Medicine in the NHS

The NHS Confederation has recently published a research paper with the above title. It is an in depth study on the level and scope of complementary medicine (CM) being practised in a typical location and highlights the key management issues which need to be addressed if CM¹s use within the NHS is to develop in a rational and systematic way. It is based on questionnaire surveys and interviews with a wide range of health professionals and managers. The paper calls for a government funded national initiative in the field to ensure that such issues as effectiveness, training, qualifications, competence and funding are addressed. American Threat to Organic Food

We have recently received some information about a 600 page USDA document setting out its standards for organic agriculture in the US. It appears that large genetic and agrochemical companies have pressurised the department into classifying the following practices as organic!

- A) The use of genetically engineered crops
- B) The practice of intensive animal farming
- C) The routine use of antibiotics and other animal drugs
- D) The irradiation of organic food
- E) The use of many chemicals on crops which are currently considered unacceptable
- F) A more liberal use of non-organic ingredients in processed organic foods.

Furthermore, the USDA is proposing to make the costs of organic registration so high that only the largest of growers will be able to afford them. Astonishingly the USDA will make it illegal for any independent organic certifying agency to propose a higher set of standards than those of the USDA. News from Spiritual Science Institute

The newly formed Spiritual Science Institute, headquartered in Columbus, Ohio, has recently completed preliminary testing to measure gamma radiation in a patient's energy field before and during alternative healing sessions involving Polarity therapists. The main objective of the research was to identify the cosmic energy claimed to be manipulated during these therapies. Comparison data was also collected using both scam practitioners and 'standing only' observers. Equipment and expertise for the project was provided by The Ohio State University's (OSU) Nuclear Reactor Laboratory.

The analysis completed by OSU's Biostatistics Program revealed that there were highly statistically significant differences between the amount of gamma radiation absorbed during actual Polarity treatments versus either scam or standing controls. The tests performed revealed that, although three of the four sites were significant beyond p > .001, the lower the site on the body the higher the degree of significance ranging from the pelvis region up to the crown area. Further research is being planned to isolate the exact energy level of the gamma's being manipulated which will assist the researchers in determining the dosage of energy actually present during the treatments. The team plans to submit the research results for publication in the Fall.
