### **Institute for the Advancement of Health**

The IAH was founded in 1983 with a view to furthering the scientific understanding of how mind/body interactions affect health and disease. As well as promoting sound research, the Institute serves as a clearing house for information and research findings and aims to encourage communication between researchers, the health-care community and the public. It publishes annotated bibliographies, of which three have so far appeared: **Mind and Immunity; Behavioural Immunology; Disorders of the Heart and Blood Vessels; and Disorders Associated with the Immune System.** Its quarterly journal is entitled **Advances**. The Autumn 1986 issue will be of particular interest to Members. It contains reports and discussions about mind-bodyhealth investigations from 15 countries, and includes research overviews, reports on specific topics and theoretical perspectives. ### **Institute of Noetic Sciences**

Members may be more familiar with the writings of the President, Willis Harman, than with the Institute per se. Its purpose is to expand knowledge of the nature and potentials of the mind, and apply that knowledge to the advancement of health and well-being for humankind and the planet. Aside from its continuing peace programme, the major current concern of the Institute is research into the inner mechanisms of the healing response. Investigations under way include psychoneuroimmunology, multiple personalities, positive emotions, the placebo effect, spiritual healing and the integration of outer and innersciences. Their latest special report by Brendan O'Regan is entitled **Healing, Remission and Miracle Cures**. A quarterly review full of stimulating articles was launched in December: the latest issue includes Rupert Sheldrake on Science and the Spirit and an article by Candace Pert on Neuropeptides. ### **Yoga Biomedical Trust**

It has also been demonstrated that people who are HIV positive or have ARC (AIDS-related conditions), or have the opportunistic infections associated with AIDS, can use natural treatment methods to enhance their immune systems. The aims of the Centre are to eradicate leprosy in the area and teach handicrafts to the surrounding villagers with a view to making them as self-sufficient as possible.
