Dr Robinson's research has been covered by the Guardian, the Times and the New Scientist, and he has featured multiple times on radio and television.



FRENCHMAN'S COVE

A private estate in an unspoilt part of the north east coast of Jamaica, it consists of 45 acres of rolling landscape with tropical trees and plants. A small river runs through the grounds down to its own sheltered white sandy beach. Dotted around the site are 17 spacious and secluded houses that sleep between two and six, plus a central building, the 'Great House', sleeping up to 24. Houses have a large sitting area, one or two bedrooms, en suite bathroom and a small kitchen. Many overlook the water and all have patios for sitting out. The weather in January is usually warm and sunny (25 degrees) with heavy showers and sea temperature is about 23 degrees.

Frenchmans Cove was a favourite of Hollywood celebrities such as Elizabeth Taylor and Richard Burton in the 1960s. Ian Fleming wrote one of the James Bond adventures here and it featured in the film Dr No, and several more recent films, such as Knight and Day. However, its present owner, Grainger Weston, developed the resort to provide maximum benefit to the local population and a venue for forward looking conferences. Grainger has been a great supporter of the Scientific and Medical Network and the organisors are indebted to him for all his help, encouragement and financial support. The SMN ran several conferences at Frenchman's Cove between 1999 and 2001. The new conference series began in 2009.

Our talks and discussions will be held overlooking the sea. There will be optional Yoga, Paneurhythmy or Qi Gong sessions before breakfast each morning. Lunches are on the beach and afternoons free to enjoy this beautiful place and its surroundings.
